

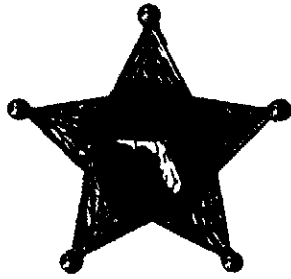

Unfortunately, we are \$5000 short of the instructional material needed. We understand that you have financial resources that may assist us.

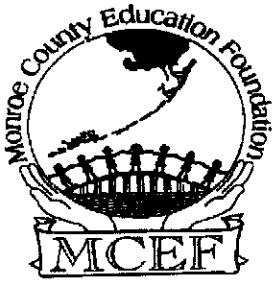

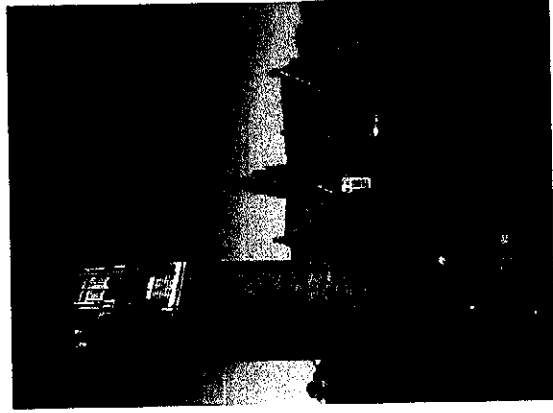
WHO WE ARE
